

Sing like never before Oh my soul I'll worship your holy name Our Bible reading was John 10:1-21 Tim spoke from the reading:

We come from different sheep pens, but we have one Lord.

We are called to be his followers and so we should lay down our lives for one another. We need to repent of saying these words glibly and to put the needs of others before ourselves. This is both within our church, for those in other churches and beyond.

## **Mission Enabler**

At 8:00 p.m., as planned, Barry Hill, Mission Enabler from the School of Mission and Ministry at Leicester Diocese joined us.

These are some notes from his address:

If you want to teach people to build boats, don't start with carpentry. Instead, instil a love of the wide boundless ocean.

In American politics the key election advisors of both George W Bush and Barack Obama only agree on only one thing. They each won because they stuck with their imperfect strategy and their opponents kept changing theirs in search of a better one.

In mission it is better to keep going with an imperfect strategy than to not start while we search for a perfect approach.

We don't need to all do the same work. We have overlapping circles (Venn diagrams) of interest: we can have shared work as well as our own activities.

There is an often told story about dignitaries visiting NASA. The man who swept the floor was asked by one of them, 'What do you do here?'. He answered 'I put a man on the moon'.

We each have a part to play. We can all own the vision.

Like a stick of rock, the same vision can run all the way through us.

The diocesan strategy is called Shaped by God. This has broadly been the same vision for eleven years. Currently this is expressed using the parable of the Mustard Seed (Matthew 13)

- Deeper discipleship: pictured as the roots
- Growth in numbers of disciples: as the branches
- Service of the others: The birds in the branches

Sometimes in the church these three have seemed to be in competition with each other. Actually, they catalyse one another.

If a mustard tree suddenly appeared in a farmers field, it would not be good news. The perfect launch pad for birds to attack the crops. What it means to be a team, to be on a mission, is painful.

The community we have known needs to reform to welcome new people. God might change us by the people he sends to us. This is already happening here (Barry keenly follows what happens in our team)

- Messy church is hard work.
- A debt help centre brings hard work.

Barry then divided the congregation into three and ask each section to discuss in pairs what is already going under the three areas

- Depth of discipleship
- Seeking more disciples
- Better serve communities

What do we want others to say of our Team in Ten Years time?


We were asked to respond under six headings
