Reading: Genesis 1:31

6th December

8th December

9th December

10th December

God, our light and our salvation, illuminate our lives, that we may see your goodness in the land of the living, and, looking on your beauty, may be changed into the likeness of Jesus Christ our Lord.











11th December

Reading: Micah 5:2-3

chosen?

Prayer:

Lord our God, supreme over all things, look upon the humble and lowly and put new strength into our souls to complete your purpose for us in Jesus Christ our Lord.

12th December

Reading: Zechariah 6:12-13

Reflection: How can we share the amazing fact

that Jesus' sacrifice on the cross was as

King of all?

Prayer:

Lord Jesus, divine Son and eternal priest, inspire us with the confidence of your final conquest of evil, and grant that daily on our way we may drink of the brook of your eternal life and so find courage against all adversities; for your mercy's sake.

13th December

Reading: Isaiah 7:14

Reflection: If God is with us, where do we see him

in our lives today?

Prayer:

Christ, the sun of righteousness, rise in our hearts this day, enfold us in the brightness of your love and bear us at the last to heaven's horizon; for your love's sake.

14th December

Reading: Isaiah 9:6

Lord God, you draw us by your beauty and transform us by your holiness; let our worship echo all creation's praise and declare your glory to the nations; through

Jesus Christ our Lord.

15th December

Reading: Mark 1:11

16th December

Reading: Revelation 22:13

Creator God, may every breath we take be for your glory, may every footstep show you as our way, that, trusting in your presence in this world, we may, beyond this life, still be with you where you are alive and reign for ever and ever.

17th December

Reading: John 1:41

Reflection: In what way is Jesus' life visible in us

and in other Christians?

Prayer:

God of our pilgrimage, you sent your Son to our strange land to bring us home to you; give us your songs to sing, that even in our exile we may be filled with the breath of the Spirit of Jesus Christ our Lord.

18th December

Reading: Luke 2:11

Reflection: Do we ever reflect on the cost of saving

us from eternal death?

Prayer:

O God, maker of heaven and earth, by the suffering of your Son you set us free; help us to put our trust in his victory and to know the salvation won for us by Jesus Christ our Lord.

19th December

Reading: John 11:25

From your royal throne, O God, you sent your living Word to pierce the gloom of oppression; come with your saving help and penetrate our darkness with the rays of your glory in Jesus Christ our Lord.

20th December

made that possible?

How can that help us?

Prayer:

Crown us, O God, but with humility, that, as you call us into the kingdom of your Son, we may strive to overcome all evil by the power of good and so walk gently on the earth with you, our God, for ever.







21st December

Reading: Luke 2:4

Reflection: Can we see God's hand at work even

through the uncomfortable laws of our

land?

Prayer:

Creator God, may every breath we take be for your glory, may every footstep show you as our way, that, trusting in your presence in this world, we may, beyond this life, still be with you where you are alive and reign for ever and ever.

22nd December

Reading: Luke 2:7

Reflection: Our Lord is born to a homeless couple

in an animal shelter.

Can we still see him in the poorest and

the dispossessed today?

Prayer:

To you we come, radiant Lord, the goal of all our desiring, beyond all earthly beauty; gentle protector, strong deliverer, in the night you are our confidence; from first light be our joy; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

23rd December

Reading: Luke 2:8-20

Reflection: Has the wonder and the glory of this

birth been lost in commercialism?

Prayer:

O God, our Sovereign and Shepherd, who brought again your Son Jesus Christ from the valley of death, comfort us with your protecting presence and your angels of goodness and love, that we also may come home and dwell with him in your house for ever.

24th December


Reading: Matthew 2:1-2
